### **SATS Update**

The government has recently announced changes to Year 2 and Year 6 Statutory Assessments.

Year 6 children will sit tests in Reading and Maths in May, although the SPAG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) test has been made non-statutory. The results of these tests will not be published, but will be passed onto secondary schools when the children move on. Teachers will still provide an assessment for children's writing in Y6 and these will be sent to the government and secondary schools as in previous years.

The timetable is also now flexible to take into account possible COVID closures and also Eid-al-Fitr, but we'll confirm the exact timetable nearer the time. We will also keep you informed of any other changes as there may still be further announcements.

Year 2 tests will be replaced with Teacher Assessments for reading, writing and maths. This will be similar to what has happened in the past, but without an actual test for the children to take.

## Reading Book Return

If you have any school books at home, please return them to school as soon as possible. We will be sorting out all of our Accelerated Reader and Big Cat Reading books as well as other classroom reading books ready for a new start in January. You risk a fine if your child does not return a Big Cat Reading book!
