 People live within these continents in a variety of different locations:

- Coast - These are areas that run along the outside of a country that has a border with the ocean/sea.
- Rainforest - These are areas with hot climates with dense vegetation like trees and plants.
- Desert - These are very hot, dry areas with lots of sand.
- Big city - Similar to Birmingham but on a much bigger scale.


What types of homes could people live in around the world ?

Vocabulary

Community	a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common
Country	a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory
City	a large town
Continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).
Capital City	the city or town that functions as the seat of government and administrative centre of a country or region.
Coast	the part of the land adjoining or near the sea.
Climate	the weather conditions prevailing in an area in general or over a long period.
Landmark	an object or feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognized from a distance, especially one that enables someone to establish their location.
Remote	(of a place) situated far from the main centres of population; distant.
Rainforest	a luxuriant, dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall.
